


Successful Launch for Volume III

VCH Treasurer Cathrin Wharton says; 'Combining the two separate events to make a day has proved very successful in the past, particularly as both share some common membership. In addition we have what promises to be a very interesting lecture in the afternoon. We hope to see as many members as possible on the day.'

This is now having significant benefits for local history in the county.'

Key-note AGM lecture on Parker and Unwin

Our 2014 AGM lecture on Saturday 28 June, at around 2.30pm, will feature a key-note lecture on the Derbyshire Works of Barry Parker and Raymond Unwin, by the foremost expert on the two – Dr Mervyn Miller.

Dr. Miller will examine how the two's works helped propel them to international acclaim via the Garden City Movement and the masterplanning of New Earswick, Letchworth Garden City and Hampstead Garden Suburb. Particularly housing, but also individual Arts and Crafts houses will be examined, including those at Barrow Hill, Buxton, Chesterfield and Matlock.

Dr Miller has extensively studied and written about Parker's and Unwin's work and of planning and architecture in general.
