Hyperlinks

For those not 'in the know' hyperlinks are links embedded into text which should automatically open websites when clicked. They are highlighted in this e-News in blue like this example here - https://derbyshirevch.org/. To use them simply hover your computer cursor over the coloured text, press down 'Ctrl' on your keyboard and click at the same time. This will then open the linked website. If you are using a tablet or smart phone it is even easier. Just touch the coloured text with your finger.

Publications update

1- Current work

Work is currently being undertaken on draft text for the next VCH spin-off book – on Wingerworth – which we hope to launch during 2023. This should then be followed by a volume covering both Calow and Temple Normanton.

Work on Wingerworth has recently progressed quickly mainly due to the efforts of David Edwards, who drafted a considerable amount of text some years ago. This has been added to by our volunteer group along with research by our county editor at The National Archives, Kew. Philip Riden identified a considerable amount of new material at Kew and has been visiting to examine this previously unused source. The papers relate to a number of Chancery cases, which reveal more about Wingerworth and other Chesterfield townships. This is new information, not previously identified.

2 - Hasland book sell-out

Our Hasland book has sold out and we only have a few copies of 'Chesterfield Streets and Houses' left.

3 - VCH Volume III available

The original publishers of our VCH Volume III (Bolsover and adjacent parishes) – Boydell & Brewer – decided to remainder copies of the book last year. The Trust decided to purchase all remaining copies from them and are now able to offer these at £60 plus postage and packing.
