AGM report

As you will be aware our annual general meeting was held at the Imperial Rooms, Matlock in the afternoon of Saturday 23 September. This was preceded in the morning, as is now usual, by the AGM of the Derbyshire Record Society (DRS).

The DRS meeting also saw the launch of the *Derbyshire Feet of Fines 1196-1324* edited by the late HJH Garratt, followed by lunch, which was also available to VCH Trust members.

Our own AGM saw the usual reports by officers. There is nothing out of the ordinary to report – the VCH Trust continues to function without any great problems or issues; our finances remain at a satisfactory level, with our webpages and Facebook accounts regularly updated.

As our county editor (Philip Riden) reported; there have been no publications issued during the year under review, but it is expected that the Wingerworth book we referred to in our last electronic newsletter, will be published either in late 2023 or early 2024. Much work was carried out by long-standing supporter and much-respected local historian David Edwards towards this publication, though this is being supplemented by some additional research work. Our 'History of Hasland...' book, successfully launched in June 2022, has been effectively sold out for a few months. Though a few copies were available at the meeting, by the time you read this newsletter we will not have any in stock. Only a few copies of the 'Chesterfield Streets and Houses' book remain with us. Other publications remain in active research or editing, with the next one still expected to be a combined volume on Calow and Temple Normanton.

Philip further reported that the Chesterfield volunteer group (see below) continues to function, with various strands of research continuing. He ended his report by thanking all our VCH supporters.

The afternoon concluded with an excellent talk by Peter Collinge who looked at four case-studies of Derbyshire businesswomen in Georgian times.

New trust chair - Lesley Phillips

Elected at our AGM – we have a new chairman of the VCH Trust – Lesley Phillips – after our existing chair Lyn Pardo Roques stepped down. Lyn is, however, remaining on the VCH committee. Lesley will doubtless be a familiar face to many – as she was local studies librarian at Chesterfield for many years. Our thanks to Lyn for chairing our committee and a warm welcome to Lesley.

I grew up in the Black Country, and studied at Halesowen Grammar School and Loughborough University. After University I moved around, and have lived in Stratford on Avon, Leighton Buzzard, and Melton Mowbray amongst other places, but finally settled in Derbyshire, where I have lived for more than 30 years now. I have been a member of North Wingfield Local History Group for most of that time.

I have been interested in local history for as long as I can remember, and worked as a local studies librarian at Chesterfield for 10 years. At first I supported the VCH groups meeting at Chesterfield Library as part of my

job, but I was so impressed with their enthusiasm, knowledge and work that I had to join in!

What does the VCH committee do?

Members of our committee are listed at the very bottom of the newsletter. We meet about three to four times a year to keep an eye on things like finance, publicity (now generally through electronic means) and receive reports from the county editor. We also make arrangements for the AGM and some other activities, such as attendance at exhibitions.

Volunteer group news

Our Chesterfield volunteer evening group has continued to meet in the period up to the summer recess – after a break it has now reconvened at Chesterfield Library. As always you are very welcome to join us. We meet in term time at Chesterfield Library (lower New Beetwell Street entrance to the meeting rooms suite), from 7 pm until 9 pm, every Wednesday. If you fancy joining us please get in-touch with our County Editor - philip.riden@nottingham.ac.uk – beforehand. No previous experience of local history research is required. During the last year or so we have picked up quite a few new members and are pleased to see that they have continued with the group.

Our research group has enabled much more information to be gathered and sorted than would have been the case without it. We have also been able to use the extensive local studies collection at Chesterfield library – our thanks to the library staff there who have enabled this.

At one time the VCH Trust had research groups in Matlock and south Derbyshire, but we were not able to sustain these for one reason or another. Their work, though, has not been 'lost' as all research notes (generally in our 'slip' format) have been retained for future use.

Back publications

A further reminder that our VCH Volume III ('Bolsover and adjacent parishes') is available direct from the trust at £60 plus postage and packing. As mentioned above our 'Chesterfield Streets and Houses' VCH spin-off book is still just about available (at £20 plus postage and packing), but our 'History of Hasland...' book is sold out.
