Publications update

1- Wingerworth

Work is currently being undertaken on the last of our draft text for the next VCH spin-off book on Wingerworth. We hope that this will be published later this year. Additional research has recently been carried out towards publication (see below), but much is based on the work of long-time member and VCH supporter David Edwards.

2 - Dore

Longer-term members may remember that some years ago we had a research group based in Matlock, led by Philip Riden. Three members of this group, also members of the Dore Village Society, started work on an account of that parish, which was in Derbyshire until 1935 (when the account will generally end). The text has been based on the usual VCH principles.

Philip has recently received a manuscript of this account, which should be more than capable of publication with only a limited amount of editing. It is thought that this may well be our next spin-off publication, following that on Wingerworth – but we will keep you up-to-date. Our thanks to the two volunteers who have seen this important piece of work through - Barbara Jackson and the late Anne Slater. There has also been considerable help from other members of the Dore Village Society, especially John Dunstan.

3 - Calow and Temple Normanton

With work moving onto Dore we have not forgotten what we originally thought might be our second spin-off volume of 2023/4 - covering both Calow and Temple Normanton. Work is still progressing on this, but we do not currently have an expected publication date.

4 – Back publications

A reminder that our VCH Volume III ('Bolsover and adjacent parishes') is now available direct from the trust at $f_{,60}$ plus postage and packing. Our 'Chesterfield Streets and Houses' VCH spin-off book is still

available (at $\pounds 20$ plus P & P), but our 'History of Hasland...' book is sold out. For further information email our treasurer at treasurer@derbyshirevch.org.

Research

As mentioned in our last electronic newsletter Philip Riden has recently been spending some time in The National Archives looking at a series of documents, which we do not think have been previously studied, at least in any great depth. In particular he has looked at a large number of Chancery cases, which reveal more about Wingerworth and other Chesterfield townships.
